- Utilize Apple 1:1 program through instruction, engagement, and motivation
- Supervise students in out-of-classroom activities during the assigned workday
- Perform basic attendance accounting and business services as required
- Continually evaluate student's academic and social growth
- Keep appropriate records of progress regarding strengths and weaknesses
- Establish and maintain student behavior
- Provide planned learning experiences in order to motivate students to investigate and inquire in search for more knowledge
- Build and maintain relationships (Students, Parents, Colleagues, Community Members, Etc...)
