
Clarksville Academy Middle School Summer Reading 2023

This year's summer reading selections across all grade levels (3-12) are situated within a common theme of building a community of belonging and acceptance.

Reading Journals

The reading journal is a place for you to grapple with meaning. You will write a total of three one-page journal entires about three chapters that you find meaningful and make a connection within building a community of belonging and acceptance. Please handwrite your journals on notebook paper. NO TYPING. Each journal entry should include the following:

- Chapter title
- Summary of the chapter
- An explanation about why you chose this chapter.
- A meaningful quotation from the chapter.
- An explanation of the meaning of the quotation.
- Does this chapter relate to our theme of building a positive community of belonging and acceptance? Explain why or why not.
